




### The Face of Hunger



Holly started visiting a food pantry eight months ago. She was pregnant with her daughter Ivy, who is now six months old, and had to cut back her hours as a manager at a fast-food restaurant.

"Thankfully, I was able to work through the pandemic," she said, but with three kids, the food distributions have "really become a necessity at my house."

Holly is working part-time, and her husband has full-time work at an area hospital, but they're still living paycheck to paycheck, she said. "Thank goodness this is here, and it helps us fill that gap until we get paid again. It's been a tremendous help."
